#### **Create a Quilt Square to Honor Your Loved One**

At Midwest Transplant Network, we are honored to support donor families in creating meaningful tributes to their loved ones. As part of this, we offer free quilt square packets to help you craft a square for our Donor Memorial Quilt.

To request a packet, please email **aftercare@mwtn.org** with your name and mailing address. Each packet includes:

- A quilt square template
- Photo transfer paper
- A photo release form
- A return envelope

If you decide to create a quilt square in honor of your loved one, please follow these guidelines:

- **Size:** The quilt square must measure **8 inches** by **8 inches**, with the design contained within the center **7 inches** to leave a half-inch border on all sides for stitching.
- **Fabric:** You may use any fabric color, including sentimental materials such as a baby blanket, tie, or shirt that belonged to your loved one. However, avoid using jersey or stretch fabric, as they are unsuitable for quilting.
- **Design:** Personalize your square with paint, permanent markers, glitter, thread or other materials. You are welcome to include poems, quotes, symbols and your loved one's name. If you add trinkets or embellishments, please securely sew them to the square rather than using glue, as glue may degrade over time.
- **Photographs:** If you would like to include a photo, you can:
  - Have the photo transferred onto fabric by a copy shop.
  - Use the photo transfer paper provided in your packet with an inkjet printer.
  - Please avoid laminating photos, as laminated squares may not be suitable for the final quilt due to issues the lamination creates during the quilting process.
- **Finishing:** Do not quilt, back or otherwise "finish" the square.
- **Submission:** Only one square is permitted per donor. You may mail your completed square using the envelope provided or bring it to one of our Celebration of Heroes events, where you can pin it on our donor memorial quilt.

We hope this project brings you comfort and provides a meaningful way to celebrate your loved one's legacy. If you have any questions or need assistance, please don't hesitate to contact us.

### **Introducing MTN's Open Communication Policy**

idwest Transplant Network values the healing and connection that can happen when donor families and recipients choose to communicate with one another. With this in mind, we are updating our policies to support open communication between donor families and recipients in a way that respects individual preferences.

As part of this change, MTN will no longer require correspondence to be written anonymously, nor will we remove identifying details or contact information you share in your letter. This approach empowers both donor families and recipients to share their stories and connect in the way that feels most meaningful to them.

#### Here are a few key aspects of this new policy:

- Respecting Choices: If personal or identifying information is included in correspondence, MTN will forward it exactly as written, and the individual is doing so with the knowledge that the correspondence will be forwarded as written.
- Maintaining Privacy: If a donor family or recipient prefers to remain anonymous, MTN will fully support their decision and ensure their personal information is not shared.
- Thoughtful Sharing: We encourage you to carefully consider how much personal information you wish to include. You may opt to share limited details, such as only providing an email address or phone number. Please note that once personal information is shared, MTN cannot take responsibility for how it is used or the outcomes of direct communication.
- Understanding Identifiers: Even if you do not explicitly share contact details, certain information — such as your name, city or state, employer, school affiliation, date of birth or names of relatives — could enable recipients to identify you online. In such cases, these individuals are acting independently, and MTN cannot assume responsibility for the outcome.
- Collaboration with other Organ Procurement Organizations (OPO): Depending on the recipient's location, written communication may be facilitated through the OPO in the recipient's area. Some of these organizations have different policies regarding the sharing of personal information. In such cases, MTN will work closely with them to ensure all necessary steps are taken for open communication to proceed. This may include completing a consent and release form.

We are honored to facilitate these connections and remain committed to supporting donor families and recipients as they navigate their unique journeys.

### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### How do I communicate with my loved one's recipients?

Midwest Transplant Network (MTN) recognizes that open and direct communication between donor families and recipients can be both healing and meaningful. As part of our commitment to supporting these connections, we now allow open communication between donor families and recipients. This means individuals are no longer required to write anonymously, and we will no longer redact identifying details or contact information from correspondence. # What is the Donor Memorial Quilt and how do I make a quilt square?

The Donor Memorial Quilt is a collaborative tribute created by donor families to honor those who have given the gift of life through organ, tissue and eye donation. Families can create a quilt square to celebrate their loved ones anytime. Please note that there are specific size guidelines that must be followed.
